Dr. Valentine Andreoulas: *'Writing Apprehension and Assessment. Can we use AI to help students improve and feel less stressed?'*

SUMMARY

Writing apprehension hinders EFL students due to fear of negative evaluation, low confidence, and unfamiliarity with grammar. Studies in Greece highlight its impact on academic performance. AI tools like grammar checkers provide immediate, personalised feedback, reducing anxiety and improving writing skills. Teachers should integrate these tools as aids, promote collaborative activities, and foster supportive environments to enhance students' confidence and autonomy in writing.
